2. SPECIFIC DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

3. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the January 20th, 2015 meeting were amended, approved by the council and signed as correct by the chairman.

4. REPORT FROM ALL SAINTS CHURCH, CHALGRAVE

No report this month as Mr Calder was unable to attend the meeting.

5. POLICE MATTERS

- a) <u>Crime Figures.</u> None available this month.
- b) The Plough Car Park. Cllr Wells said that there had been an altercation on the road between The Plough and its car park on January 21st, 2015. Although a crime reference number was available it was not reported on Ringmaster. Cllr Osborn will follow up and find out what the criteria are for a crime to be reported on Ringmaster. DO
- c) Meeting with PCC Olly Martins. Cllr Osborn attended a meeting recently with the PCC. The PCC is proposing an increase of the police precept of 15.8% which would pay for 100 additional police officers plus 30 to be deployed from stations in Central Bedfordshire. He asked those attending to publicise the referendum relating to this proposed increase and for comments to be sent to www.bedspcc.org
- d) <u>Criminal Damage: Hockliffe Road.</u> A Customer Services Officer has spoken to Cllr Osborn regarding the incident in which a vehicle was driven through closed farm gates and a cow being killed. In an email to the clerk the officer stated that Cllr Osborn is satisfied that matters are being addressed and he is not so much worried about time being spent looking into the incident and the time it took the attending officers to arrive as to the future policing of rural areas.
- e) <u>New recruits.</u> Bedfordshire Police are seeking potential new recruits after welcoming 33 student officers to the force in February.

6. MATTERS ARISING FROM JANUARY 20TH, 2015 MINUTES

- a) <u>Parochial Church Council Meeting.</u> The meeting was held on Wednesday January 28th, 2015. Cllr Parry attended.
- b) <u>Incident Reporting Board.</u> Cllr Osborn suggested putting a message board opposite the Queen's Head. Cllr Osborn will acquire a board and pens. Ongoing <u>DO</u>
- c) 800,000 Unreported Crimes. Cllr Parry will write a short article for The Chalgrave News encouraging people to report crimes. PP
- d) Referring to a recent letter from PCC Olly Martins Cllr Wells questioned why only 88% of crimes are recorded, a figure described as 'good' by the PCC and what does the other 12% represent? The clerk will write to the PCC accordingly. Clerk
- e) <u>CIIr Versallion</u>.Cllr Green has emailed Cllr Versallion about using brown field land for building. Awaiting response. Ongoing.
- f) Overgrown Trees; 23 Toddington Road, Tebworth. Ongoing.
- g) 20mph through Flitton and Greenfield. Cllr Wells reported that Flitton and Greenfield PC had approached Amy directly but had the support of the police as well. There had also been two fatalities on the road. Clerk to check who came to came to speak to Chalgrave PC about traffic calming in the past. Clerk
- Tebworth Road, Wingfield-Pipeworks. Cllr Wells reported a water leak opposite Heath Farm, Tebworth Road, Wingfield. Cllr Parry will draft a letter to Anglian Water asking for the problem to be resolved.

- i) Defibrillator. Cllr Mence reported that an electrician has quoted £235 to install the defibrillator. Cllr Parry and the clerk will draft an agreement between the PC and Chalgrave Memorial Hall. There should also be a contract for annual servicing with Community Heartbeat. Once the defibrillator is installed the PC can apply for training on how to use it. The PC aims to have the defibrillator functioning by the date of the Parish Assembly on April 28th, 2015. Ongoing.

- **j) CBC;** Local Transport Plan: Rural Match Funding Guidelines. CBC has introduced a 'matched funding' scheme' whereby rural parishes contribute 50% towards repairs etc. which Cllr Green considers unfair. A letter has been sent to this effect. Awaiting reply.
- k) <u>Vehicle Activated Signs.</u> Cllr Whitton is waiting to hear from Swarco regarding a quote for refurbishing the VAS on Toddington Road. The cost for the lights and refurbishment will be £400 approximately. Ongoing.

- I) HW: Temporary Road Closure; Leighton Road, Toddington. The closure took place in February. Cllrs commented that the diversion route worked well.
- m) Water Leaks.
 - i. The leak outside the Grand Chapel, Toddington Road originates in St. Mary's Close. Cllr Parry will follow up. **PP**
 - ii. Cllrs felt that it took a long time, 6 days, for Anglian Water to repair the leak outside 7 Toddington Road. Anglian Water has responded saying it was due to a lack of manpower.
- n) <u>Hill Close.</u> The verge by the entrance to the cricket pitch has become churned up. Cllr Parry has spoken to a nearby resident who is currently carrying out building work. The Sports Club are going to install posts to stop vehicles parking on the verge.
- o) <u>Parkview Lane.</u> Ongoing.
- **p)** <u>**Gulleys.**</u> The gulleys have been cleaned recently. The HW Area Technician is looking into an alternative solution regarding the flooding at the junction of Wingfield Road and Parkview Lane.
