2. MINUTES OF OCTOBER 17th, 2017 MEETING

The minutes of the October 17th, 2017 meeting were approved and signed as correct by the chairman.

4. POLICE MATTERS

- a) <u>Crime figures.</u> No crimes have been reported for October 2017
- b) <u>Police and Crime Commissioner: On the Record Newsletter.</u> November 2017 edition in correspondence.

5. REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLOR VERSALLION

No report this month.

6. <u>REPORT FROM ALL SAINTS CHURCH</u>

Cllr Parry said the London Philharmonic Skiffle Orchestra held on November 17th at the church was successful and raised a lot of money.

7. MATTERS ARISING FROM OCTOBER 17th, 2017 MINUTES

- a) <u>Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS); Toddington Road.</u> Cllr Parry reported that matched funding was not an option as the PC would have to contribute £2,500 but if the project was not selected the money would not be returned. However it is still a good idea to replace the current sign. Cllr Ludgate suggested waiting until the 20mph limit is in place. Ongoing.
- b) Parish Council Computer. In progress.
- c) <u>Article 4; Queen's Head.</u> Cllr Parry informed the cllrs that the person believed to have bought the pub has not. Mr. Roger Masters, who was present at the PC meeting, said that Andrew Selous MP is suggesting that the bid has not gone through. Ongoing.
- d) <u>Community Plan.</u> The clerk will contact CBC regarding what progress has been made on the Community Plan. <u>Clerk</u>
- e) <u>CBC: Draft Local Plan.</u> Jason Longhurst, Director of Regeneration and Business has sent an update on the progress with the draft Local Plan. During the summer CBC consulted on the draft. Comments made can be read at <u>www.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/planning/policy/local-plan/reg-18/overview.aspx</u> CBC also undertook a telephone survey across Central Bedfordshire. The results from this research are at www.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/planning/policy/local-plan/telephone-survey/overview.aspx

CBC local governance arrangements are currently being reviewed and there will be a public consultation early in the New Year for six weeks.

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- f) <u>Emergency Planning.</u> In progress.
- g) Lane Farm. Cllr Versallion has spoken to James Jamieson, Leader CBC about non-response by CBC to letters sent by the PC. He will discuss this with Cllr Green as both are attending the Town and Parish Council Conference this evening.
- h) <u>CBC: The Stables and Greenacres Gypsy and Travellers' Sites.</u> Clerk has contacted CBC to find out whether residents on council owned sites pay council tax. Awaiting response. <u>Clerk</u>
- i) <u>Velocity Patcher</u>. Cllr Levy said that HW may have filled in an area opposite her house. To be monitored when it next rains.
- j) 7.5 Tonne Limit Signs. CBC has contacted Highways England to cut back the growth obscuring the sign on the northbound A5 at the Tebworth turn. CBC has also said that there is a 'Terminal Sign' at M1 J12 which prevents HGVs going into Toddington other than for access.
- k) <u>NALC: Planning for the Right Homes in the Right Places.</u> DCLG launched a consultation on the proposed changes to planning policy design and legislation. Both CPRE and London Green Belt Council (LGBC) have sent responses. LGBC has also written to Sajid Javid MP, Secretary of State for the Department of Communities and Local Government, to express its concern for the proposed new legislation. All in correspondence.
- I) <u>Section 106.</u> Adam Zemy, Independent Cllr CBC, has thanked parish and town councils for their feedback on how s106 money is spent. He attended CBC's full Council meeting on November 16th. Whilst there is some recognition that the way s106 money is spent needs reform town and parish councils will not be consulted on how the money is spent. Cllr Zemy's email is in correspondence.
- m) Dept for Digital, Culture Media and Sport: A Data Protection Officer (DPO) now must be appointed by PCs. The role can be fulfilled by the clerk. There will be a legal requirement on data controllers to pay a data protection fee when new data protection legislation comes into force in 2018 of £30 approx.
