5. PRESENTATION ON the HOUGHTON REGIS NORTH 1 DEVELOPMENT

- a) <u>Overview.</u> Mr Handel's company provides services to the UK development industry. He gave a brief outline of the project so far, which includes the construction of the A5-M1 Link and the Woodside Link. He explained that the landowner of the land being developed is the Diocese of St. Albans and in 2017 Aviva became the new development partner. Up to 5,150 new homes will be built in total and there will be a large Lidl warehouse will be built alongside the M1 just south of Jct 11a.
- **b)** <u>**Green Belt.**</u> Cllr Green commented that the PC was against the development because it would be on Green Belt land. Mr Handel replied that he considers it is a sustainable site.
- c) <u>Affordable Housing.</u> Cllr Green said that the PC wants more affordable housing like the old-style council houses. Ms Leary said that the minimum requirement for affordable housing is 10% throughout the site. However CBC can elect to provide more. The actual numbers are available in the CBC development document.
- d) <u>Schools.</u> Cllr Ludgate asked if three new primary schools would be adequate. Ms Leary replied that CBC thought it would.
