1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Ward Cllr M Versallion; PCSO Wells.

2. ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN.

- a) The current chairman, Cllr Parry, stepped down. Cllr Levy took the chair pro-tem.
- b) <u>Nominations for Chairman</u>. Cllr Whitton nominated Cllr Parry. This was seconded by Cllr Day. The vote was unanimous. Therefore Cllr Parry is duly elected as Chairman.
- c) <u>Nominations for Vice-Chairman</u>. Cllr Ludgate nominated Cllr Green. This was seconded by Cllr Whitton. The vote was unanimous. Therefore Cllr Green is duly elected as Vice-Chairman.

3. CHAIRMAN'S DECLARATION OF ACCEPTANCE OF OFFICE

Cllr Parry signed his Declaration of Acceptance of Office form. The clerk counter-signed.

4. ELECTION OF COMMITTEES CHAIRMEN.

- a) <u>Planning.</u> Cllr Green nominated Cllr Levy. This was seconded by Cllr Whitton. The vote was unanimous. Therefore Cllr Levy remains as Chairman of the Planning Committee.
- **b)** <u>Footpaths.</u> Cllr Levy nominated Cllr Green. This was seconded by Cllr Ludgate. The vote was unanimous. Therefore Cllr Green remains as Chairman of the Footpaths Committee.
- c) <u>Speed Watch.</u> Cllr Parry nominated Mike Wells. This was seconded by Cllr Green. The vote was unanimous. Therefore Mike Wells remains as Chairman of the Speed Watch Committee.
- <u>d)</u> <u>Website.</u> Cllr Parry nominated Cllr Green. This was seconded by Cllr Levy. The vote was unanimous. Therefore Cllr Green becomes Chairman of the Website Committee.

5. <u>M1 JCT13-16 SMART MOTORWAY SCHEME: PRESENTATION by MR ALAN JONES</u>

- a) <u>Summary.</u> Mr Jones explained that another lane is to be added between jcts 13-16. This is a three-year scheme. The site office will be at jct 15A and it will have an open-door policy.
- b) <u>Trees</u> need to be cut down so there will be road closures between 12am and 6am. It is likely to be noisy so there will be information on the website as to where the work will be taking place to advise residents, and updates will be sent to parish councils. Cllr Parry asked how over runs were managed. Mr Jones replied that they had a good record for keeping to time but the work could continue the next day if necessary.

- c) <u>Cameras.</u> There will be cameras throughout the works for safety reasons e.g. breakdowns.
- d) <u>M1: 7.5 Tonne Limit Signs.</u> Cllrs Parry and Levy brought up the lack of signage on the M1 approaching jct 12. Consequently some HGV drivers are unaware of the weight limit through Toddington, Tebworth and Wingfield and turn off the motorway. By the time they become aware of the limit they are unable to turn around and end up coming through the villages. Mr Jones said he has regular meetings with Highways England and will bring this issue up with them.
- e) <u>Diversion Routes.</u> Mr Baptista will double check the diversion routes that will be in place whilst work is in progress.

10. REPORT FROM ALL SAINTS CHURCH

- a) <u>Chat and Chomp Event.</u> The first Chat and Chomp event took place on Saturday, May 12th, from 10am until noon. The event was well attended by Chalgrave parishioners. Bacon and sausage rolls and cake were on offer. The event raised £171. Another Chat and Chomp is provisionally arranged for July.
