2. MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 20th, 2018 MEETING

The minutes of the November 20th, 2018 meeting were amended, approved and signed as correct by the chairman.

4. REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLOR VERSALLION

- **a)** Police. Central Bedfordshire, Bedford Borough and Luton Borough Councils have received £8 million from central government for the police. However more is needed. Areas with airports usually receive special funding from the government but Luton doesn't. Cllr Versallion has queried why this is so.
- b) <u>Highways England (HE).</u> Cllr Versallion has spent time with HE to discuss the congestion and speed of traffic through Hockliffe. HE is doing its best with limited finance. They are publishing something this January but Cllr Versallion is not impressed with the proposals. He said that rerouting the traffic along the A505 and A4146 would be costly and Buckinghamshire County Council would have to be agreeable. If this were to happen the A5 would be detrunked and become the responsibility of CBC. Cllr Green commented that the increase in housing will increase the congestion.

5. CHURCH REPORT from Steve Calder

a) Recent Events.

- Almost 40 people attended a Harvest Lunch in October with most preparing and bringing food
- The fund-raising committee organised a Christmas themed afternoon tea. It was held on December 1st with over 50 diners attending. It included a secret auction and over all £900 was made on the day.

b) Other News

- St. Albans diocese has just written off an historic debt so the church is now debt free.
- There was a theft from a car in the church car park recently. Also there are cars unrelated to church using the car park during the day and late at night. The resident in one of the nearby houses has offered to have a key to lock and unlock the gate early morning and evening as he is keen to deter negative use of the car park.
- A large amount of rubbish has been dumped in Church Lane. *

- Work on the new toilet starts in February.
- Weekly numbers are going up slightly to the low 20s.
- The Quintet Choir with members from Chalgrave are singing in 9 lessons and carols at Westoning, Toddington and Chalgrave.
