2. MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 4th, 2018 MEETING

The minutes of the September 4th, 2018 meeting were approved and signed as correct by the chairman.

3. SPECIFIC DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

4. POLICE MATTERS

<u>PC Maden</u> introduced himself. He is based at Leighton Buzzard Community Police and Fire Station and is our single point of contact. Cllrs brought up the following issues with PC Maden.

- **a)** Parking on the corner of Wingfield Road/Toddington Road. PC Maden said he could advise the car owners and/or move them on. Ongoing.
- **b)** Parking on The Lane. Cllr Parry mentioned that cars are parking near the triangle and not leaving enough room for farm vehicles and emergency vehicles. PC Maden made a note of this. Ongoing.
- **c)** Fly Tipping. Cllr Parry reported that there was fly tipping at the end of Tebworth Road, Chalgrave Road and The Lane. All reported to CBC.
- **d)** <u>Car Accident.</u> On Saturday, September 29th at 5.30am approximately a speeding car hit the wall of 1 Home Farm. The clerk asked if PC Maden had any details. He said he would find out and let the PC know.
- e) <u>Black BMW.</u> Cllrs reported a black BMW parking outside the Memorial Hall periodically at night and also a white Astra parked in the gateway by Rose's Farm. PC Maden said it would benefit a late-night drive by.

- i) <u>Stealthcam.</u> There have been three prosecutions for fly tipping in the parish so far. Clerk to find out the cost of 'CCTV in operation' signs.

The injunction also stops any unauthorised encampments on specific parcels of land in Ridgmont, Husborne Crawley, Brogborough, Salford, Lidlington, Marston Moretaine, Lower Shelton and Wootton.
