 - i. <u>Suspicious Car.</u> Cllr Parry had previously reported a car regularly parked in the gateway to the Memorial Hall. PC Bonney has recently checked and the car is no longer there.

5. <u>REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLOR VERSALLION</u>

No report this month.

6. CHURCH REPORT by MR STEVE CALDER

- a) <u>Church Grant</u>. Steve thanked the PC for its continued financial support towards maintaining the churchyard. Two volunteers cut the grass and tend to the areas in and around the graves.
- **b)** <u>Attendances</u> are stable and gently growing on Sunday morning services, one reason being the earlier start time of 9.15am. There a Christening service on September 22nd at 2pm.

- c) <u>Peter Freeman</u>, the organist and organiser of events for the church, died on April 1st, 2019. He chose the hymns appropriate to the readings and brought the services to life. He is missed by all.
- d) <u>Organists.</u> Sunday morning services are currently covered by a rota of organists.
- e) <u>Toilet Installation</u> is complete where the vestry used to be. The new vestry will be moved upstairs but has been delayed as the carpenter's workshop was destroyed in a recent fire. The builder is currently looking for a new carpenter to complete the works.
- f) <u>Alpha Course.</u> This ran through the spring and summer in Chalgrave Memorial Hall. It was very successful and people are invited to join the next Alpha course, hopefully at the same venue.
- **g)** <u>**Rev. Linda Washington**</u> has been working hard in the community with parishioners experiencing ill health and with Christenings, baptisms and weddings.

7. MATTERS ARISING FROM September 17th, 2019 MINUTES

- a) <u>Fly Tipping.</u> Cllr Masters **proposed** installing another CCTV sign by the gulley on Chalgrave Road as fly tipping frequently occurs there. The PC **unanimously agreed** to the proposal. Clerk to purchase another sign. <u>Clerk</u>
- b) <u>Queen's Head.</u> The PC has put the application for the Asset of Community Value (ACV) for the pub garden on hold. Cllr Parry will speak to the landlord to find out the position with his lease for the pub. <u>PP</u>
- c) <u>A5-M1 Link Road/B5120 Roundabout.</u> Cllr Versallion has asked Highways England (HA) to have a site meeting with him and a parish council member regarding the lane markings. He contracted them again in July. but has not had a response. He chased them at the beginning of last week and is awaiting a reply. Cllr Warburton thinks the speed of approach to the roundabout is also an issue. The PC representative at the site meeting will discuss this with HA. Ongoing.
- a) <u>Swift Boxes.</u> The clerk will ask the church warden if some Swift Boxes could be installed at Chalgrave Churchyard.

b) <u>**Tebworth Pond.**</u> The PC is now registered as the owner of an area of the pond and surrounds known as the 'Blue Land'. Barbara Jackson has contacted the Wildlife Trust regarding the best way to clear the pondweed.

a) <u>Litter.</u>

- i. Cllr Masters spoke to the manager of McDonalds on September 16th. He agreed to carry out a risk assessment along Hockliffe Road. He will also provide bags if residents arrange a litter pick.
- ii. The PC discussed whether to support the Big Beds Clean Up campaign. The PC agreed to suggest this in an article in the Chalgrave News and on the website and see what the response is. Cllrs Parry and Masters to write the article. <u>Clerk</u>
- b) <u>London Green Belt Council: Press Release on Green Belt and Climate Change.</u> Cllr Green suggested writing to CBC to ask their view on the press release and Cllr Masters commented that it was another argument against overdevelopment on Green Belt land.
