- <u>c)</u> <u>Beds Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC).</u> Cllr Parry attended the PCC's Annual Parish Conference on October 1st, 2019. He said that Bedfordshire Police lack government funding because the county is classed as a rural area. Report in correspondence.
- d) <u>PC James Bonney</u> is the Beat Officer for Chalgrave, Toddington and Chalton. He informed the PC about the theft of an Amazon delivery van whilst out on deliveries in Tebworth, which is likely to have been targeted and not a localised issue.

5. <u>REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLOR VERSALLION</u>

6. <u>CHURCH REPORT by MR STEVE CALDER</u>

- a) <u>Harvest Service</u> The church looked wonderful following its decoration the week before and lasted a long time. The service was well attended and numbers in church are still increasing.
- b) Bookings. This year there have been two baptisms and two weddings. Parishioners from Tebworth and Wingfield attended, which has given opportunity for further connections and possible links for the 800 years celebration next year.
- c) <u>800 Year Celebration.</u> Mrs Sandy Ryan and Cllr Parry met for an initial discussion about how the villages and churches can work together to celebrate 800 years. They will meet again, along with Cllr Warburton. Rev.

Linda Washington had a further discussion with Mr Roger Masters (Chalgrave Memorial Hall) and Mr Tom Dibb (local musician) on Saturday about further possibilities. The church is keen that this be a parish celebration.

- <u>d</u>) <u>Stained-Glass Window</u>. Early discussions have taken place with the architect about the possibility to install a stained-glass window in church to commemorate the 800 years and the church will be shortlisting a few designers. Unfortunately, there may not be enough time for this project to be completed by next September.
- e) <u>Toilet Installation</u>. The new indoor toilet facility is already proving its worth, but the installation of the vestry storage cupboards is still ongoing.
- **f) <u>Bible Study Group</u>** begins tonight at the Rectory in Toddington at 8.15pm. A good turnout is expected each week through till mid-December. All are welcome.
- g) In Loving Memory Service at Chalgrave Church, 3pm on October 27th,2019
- h) Remembrance Service at Chalgrave Memorial Hall, 3pm on November 10th, 2019 accompanied by Ian Smith from Toddington Band as this is the first year without Peter Freeman.
- i) Christmas Afternoon Teas on December 7th, 2019
- j) <u>Christmas services</u> will take place: Crib Service, Carols by Candlelight, Midnight Mass. Organist cover has been arranged. As ever, the church is grateful to the small and very hard-working team which keep the church in good order.
- k)Church Tower.Cllr Day asked if the tower could be opened up and a discussion followed as to whether this
could be used as a fund raiser. Steve Calder will inquire.SC

7. MATTERS ARISING FROM OCTOBER 15th, 2019 MINUTES

- a) <u>Fly Tipping.</u> The PC has another CCTV sign which needs putting up by the gulley on Chalgrave Road as fly tipping frequently occurs there. Cllr Ludgate will investigate a suitable site. <u>KL</u>
- b) <u>A5-M1 Link Road/B5120 Roundabout.</u> Clerk to contact Cllr Versallion again about a site meeting with Highways England (HA) and a parish council member about the lane markings. Ongoing. <u>Clerk</u>
- c) <u>Swift Boxes.</u> Rev. Linda Washington has indicated that it would be difficult to erect Swift Boxes at Chalgrave Church as St Albans Diocese would have to give permission and there could be concern over the fabric of the building. Cllr Green **proposed, seconded** by Cllr Ludgate that the clerk sends a letter to Rev. Washington asking for a definitive yes or no answer. All agreed. <u>Clerk</u>

Cllr Green said he would ask the Memorial Hall Committee if boxes could be put up at the hall.
