### 2. MINUTES OF December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019 MEETING

The minutes of the December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019 meeting were approved and signed as correct by the chairman.

### 3. SPECIFIC DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

None.

### 4. POLICE MATTERS

- a) <u>Crime figures.</u> PC Bonney reported that two burglaries occurred at the beginning of the year at the cottages on Church Lane, Chalgrave.
- b) <u>All Saints Church Procession: September 2020.</u> A procession is planned to take place from Wingfield to the church along Lords Hill to celebrate the church's 800-year anniversary. In answer to a question from Cllr Parry PC Bonney said there are no legal issues so there should be no problem with this. Clerk to keep him updated on the plans.
- c) Parking on Corner of Toddington Road and Wingfield Road. This continues to be a problem, severely restricting visibility at this junction. PC Bonney said that the cars are legally parked but not appropriately. The PC is looking into installing double yellow lines at this location. In progress.
- d) <u>Police Hub.</u> Toddington Fire Station now also serves as a Police hub. However there is no guarantee that anyone will be there so report crime through the normal channels i.e. 999 or 101. PC Bonney said that if residents had any enquiries to direct them to him through the PC as the PC has his personal number.
- e) <u>Poisoned Buzzards.</u> A poisoned buzzard has been found recently by a local resident. This is the second one found within four months and is now a police matter. PC Bonney will follow up with the case officer. <u>PC Bonney</u>
- f) <u>Beds Police and Crime Commissioner: On the Record.</u> January 2020 newsletter in correspondence.

### 5. <u>REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLOR VERSALLION via email</u>

- a) <u>M1-A6 Link Road</u> has been approved.
- b) Local Plan. Following the submission of CBC's proposed timetable to the Planning Inspectors, they have responded positively, which suggests that the programme CBC is proposing will see the Local Plan adopted. There will be additional hearing sessions that will be used to discuss new evidence and any suggested changes to the plan in response to the 30<sup>th</sup>, September 2019 letter and the previous hearings. These new hearings will not be a re-run of the hearing sessions from last summer. There are elements of the timetable that are still to be determined and dates will be made available as soon possible.

### 6. CHURCH REPORT by Steve Calder

a) Christmas Services 2019:

- Carols by Candlelight: Saturday 21st December, 7pm. Both the church and car park were full. Carols and mince pies heralded the start of the Christmas celebrations.
- Crib Service: Christmas Eve at 3pm. This was a well-attended service.
- Midnight mass: Christmas Eve at 11.15pm. Once again the church and car park were full. The bells were rung ٠ about 11.45pm calling anyone about to join the congregation.
- The Audio Distribution System has broken as has the audio loop due to the works on the vestry. The church • has a £2000 bill for a new, albeit up to date system. The audio company loaned a system to the church to see it through Christmas.
- Church Lane is in a terrible state as the potholes are long and deep. The Warden, Margaret Chalmers, has written twice to HW with no response. The PC clerk and Cllr Parry have also been in communication with them. Margaret will be telephoning CBC if she has not had a response in the next two days.
- b) Grave. Cllr Green requires the birth and death dates of someone buried at Chalgrave Church. Steve will look in the register at the church. <u>SC</u>

# 7. MATTERS ARISING FROM DECEMBER 17th, 2019 MINUTES

# a) Fly Tipping.

- i. As a result of the three recent fly tipping incidents a resident has asked if a camera could be put on Chalgrave Road. Cllr Levy explained that footage collected by a PC owned camera cannot be used as evidence for a possible prosecution. This would have to be from a Police camera. Cllr Masters said that the PC is on the list for a police camera but we will not be informed of where it is located and when. Clerk to find out if the PC can put up a CCTV camera at a fly tipping location. Clerk
- The PC has another CCTV sign which needs putting up by the gulley on Chalgrave Road as fly tipping ii. frequently occurs there. Cllr Ludgate will install. The PC also **agreed** to buy another sign. <u>KL; Clerk</u>

# b) A5-M1 Link Road/B5120 Roundabout.

- The Parish Council wrote to Highways England (HE) on January 9<sup>th</sup> to give them the latest accident i. figures. Awaiting response. Ongoing.
- At the January meeting the PC agreed to put a comment on HE's Facebook page. Cllr Parry will do. PP ii.

# c) Swift Boxes.

- i. The clerk has contacted St Albans Diocese to ask about the possibility of installing nest boxes at Chalgrave Church. Awaiting response. Ongoing.
- The Memorial Hall Committee has agreed that boxes can be put up at the hall. The clerk to contact the ii. Wildlife Trust for advice about installation of the boxes and their availability. Clerk
- d) Communication with Parishioners. Ongoing.
- e) London Green Belt Council (LGBC). CPRE asked LGBC members to urge London's Mayor, Sadiq Khan, to stand firm on protecting the Green Belt, which the PC has done. LGBC has forwarded a letter of reply to the PC. In correspondence.
- f) Local Electricity Bill. The PC has received an email from Power For People thanking it for supporting the Local Electricity Bill, which will enable local communities to sell locally produced clean energy. In correspondence.

# 12. HIGHWAYS ISSUES

- a) <u>Road Traffic Accident at 1 Home Farm.</u> Another incident occurred on January 19<sup>th</sup>, 2020, where a car failed to make the bend at this location causing damage to the property. The PC agreed to ask HW for chevrons or reflective signs to be installed on the bend.
- b) <u>Church Lane: Potholes.</u> Both Cllr Parry and the clerk have contacted HW several times about the deteriorating condition of Church Lane. The road is scheduled for repair but HW is unable to give a date for the work to be done. Ongoing.
- c) <u>The Meadows.</u> The tarmac around a manhole cover almost opposite The Meadows has been reported but has not been repaired yet. Ongoing.
- d) <u>Pond Farm.</u> The caution sign for the bend near Pond Farm has been knocked over. Clerk to report. <u>Clerk</u>
- e) <u>Featherbed Lane: Pothole</u> on bend. Report.

# f) <u>Street Lamps.</u>

- i. Lamp near The Grange, Hockliffe Road has been repaired
- ii. Cllr Green will follow up the lamp near 72 Wingfield Road, Tebworth
- g) <u>Speed Sign: Hockliffe Road.</u> The sign no longer works. Ask for a new sign like the one on Toddington Road. <u>Clerk</u>
- h) Parking on Corner of Toddington Road and Wingfield Road. This continues to be a problem, severely restricting visibility at this junction. The PC is looking into installing double yellow lines at this location. Cllr Green expressed his objection to having double yellow lines. Awaiting response from HW. Cllr Parry will keep putting notes on the offending cars.
- Parking on Footway: Toddington Road. Cars have been parking on the footway leaving very little room for pedestrians to use. Cllr Parry will talk to the vehicles' owners if he sees them. Otherwise he will leave a notice on their cars.
