a) <u>Beds Police and Crime Commissioner: 4th Year Report Launch</u>. Thursday, March 19th, 2020, 16.00-20.00, at Youthscape, Bute Street, Luton. Details in correspondence.

<u>Message from Office of Police and Crime Commissioner</u>. HM Inspectorate of Constabulary and Fire and Rescue Services recently published a report on the performance of Bedfordshire Police and found it to be performing well across all areas. Inspectors found that Bedfordshire Police:

- •is 'good' at effectively reducing crime and keeping people safe
- •is 'good' at operating efficiently and providing sustainable services to the public

8. CHURCH REPORT via email

- a) St Albans Diocese has approved putting wire mess in the north side roof to stop jackdaws pulling out insulation to make nests. It has also approved the storage/ electrical cupboard to be replaced with a new one to match the new toilet vestry area.

- c) <u>Rev Linda Washington</u> is now halfway through her 3 months sabbatical. Guest vicars have done a wonderful job covering for Linda. The weather has proved challenging. Last week there were no services and the week before there was no electricity so a candlelit singalong service was held.
- d) A New Lawnmower has been purchased to keep the grass around the graves and memorials tidy.

- f) Potholes. HW has filled in the worst of the potholes.

9. MATTERS ARISING FROM JANUARY 21st, 2020 MINUTES

a) Fly Tipping.

- The PC has another CCTV sign which needs putting up by the gulley on Chalgrave Road as fly tipping frequently occurs there. Cllr Ludgate will install.

- ii. Cllr Green attended the recent Town and Parish Council Conference and the rules and regulations for use of CCTV cameras were discussed

b) A5-M1 Link Road/B5120 Roundabout.

- i. Highways England has responded to the PC's last letter stating the accident figures for the roundabout obtained from the police under the Freedom of Information Act. In correspondence
- ii. It was **agreed** to write again to Highways England to ask on what basis were the roads marked. <u>Clerk</u>
- iii. At the January meeting the PC **agreed** to put a comment on HE's Facebook page. Cllr Parry will do. **PP**

c) <u>Swift Boxes</u>. Cllr Green has declared an interest.

- i. The clerk has contacted St Albans Diocese to ask about the possibility of installing nest boxes at Chalgrave Church. The Diocese has emailed back saying that swift boxes may be installed without any diocesan permission. The advice given was to discuss the proposal with the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and obtain its support. The churchwarden and PCC Secretary have been copied in to the email. The Secretary has responded saying that swift boxes will be put on the agenda for the January 30th PCC meeting. Ongoing.
- ii. The Memorial Hall Committee has agreed that boxes can be put up at the hall. The clerk contacted the Wildlife Trust and Bedfordshire Swift Group. Representatives of both met with the clerk, Cllr Green and Roger Masters, Chairman of the Memorial Hall Committee at the hall on February 19th. The PC agreed

to buy 3 swift boxes and accessories for the hall, total cost £122.50. The PC agreed to pay 50% of the cost. Cllr Green will speak to the Hall Committee to see if it will agree to pay the other 50%. Clerk; KG

- e) <u>Air BnB, Wingfield Road.</u> Request to owners not to allow their guests to park cars on the corner of Wingfield Road and St Mary's Close as it restricts visibility for road users and blocks the way for emergency vehicles. <u>Clerk</u>
