#### 7. CHURCH REPORT

- a) Response to Corona Virus. All churches have been closed since mid-March. Virtual services and Facebook pages are showing an increase in interest. This interest in online services implies that new church must develop to meet peoples' needs.

- **c)** Work in the Tower is almost complete with just the electrical cupboard to be replaced. Wire mesh will be installed to stop jackdaws stealing insulation from the roof. Both jobs to be completed after lockdown.
- **d)** Grass and Graves. The Trustee gardeners keep both tidy. The church bought a new mower this year and the existing one was completely overhauled.
- e) New Audio Loop and speaker have been installed upstairs for bell ringing during communion.
- f) <u>Spring Afternoon Tea</u> on May 2<sup>nd</sup> had to be cancelled, unfortunately, as it was to be a major fund raiser this year.
