2. MINUTES OF JULY 21st, 2020 MEETING

The minutes of the July 21st, 2020 meeting were approved and signed as correct by the chairman.

5. REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLOR VERSALLION

No report this month.

6. OPEN FORUM

Cllr Featherstone joined the meeting to discuss the forthcoming planning application for a solar farm at Chalgrave Manor Farm. CBC granted a previous application, which was submitted in 2015 but development did not go ahead. Keith informed the Cllrs that this was the 11th application from companies wanting to to connect power related facilities to the Sundon substation. Chalton PC has objected to them all, the objections being based on the amount of Green Belt land that would be used.

7. MATTERS ARISING FROM JULY 21st, 2020 MINUTES

- a) Lords Hill Roundabout. Highways England (HE) has agreed to look again at the problem with the lane markings at the roundabout. Cllr Versallion, Ward Cllr Silvia Collins (Toddington) and Cllr Parry had a site meeting with HE on August 13th, 2020. HE has agreed to review changes without awaiting the RSA4 (expected by end of September). HE will review the following:
 - Houghton Regis approach to B5120 roundabout with a view to creating, lane 1 left only (subject to future capacity assessment)
 - Dunstable Northern Bypass approaches to the B5120 roundabout to consider rumble strips
 - To consider a general refresh of markings at the roundabouts

The timescale remains unconfirmed pending the response to the various proposals and will be subject to funding and programming. Cllr Parry is following up on progress.

- b) Fly Tipping: CCTV Signs, Cllr Parry thinks that fly tipping will continue regardless of having cameras and that pressure should be put on CBC and the government to act to reduce fly tipping. The point was made that anyone collecting waste from a household should produce a certificate to show that it would be disposed of correctly. Cllr Parry will prepare an article advising residents to ask for the right certification from anyone collecting household waste for the next Chalgrave News.
- c) <u>Defibrillator</u>. Barbara Jackson checks the defibrillator weekly.
- d) Tebworth Pond.
 - i. The PC is waiting for a <u>quote</u> for installing a gate to have access to the back of the pond.
 - ii. Cllr Day and John Wojdyla pulled out some of the pond weed at the weekend. More work needs to be done, possibly over the next two weekends.
- iii. Cllr Day is having a site meeting with the <u>newt specialist</u> towards the end of this month. <u>JD</u>
- e) Millennium and Community Awards. The PC has agreed to forgo this year's awards.
- f) <u>CPRE A6-M1 Link Road.</u> In response to CPRE's recent campaign to stop the A6-M1 link road. The PC wrote letters to Grant Shapps MP, Minister for Transport, Hilary Chipping, Chief Exec, SEMLEP and Cllr James Jamieson, Leader CBC. Mr Shapps replied in July. Cllr Jamieson has sent a response which is in correspondence.
- g) Local Plan. Cllr Green's response to the recent consultation is in correspondence.
- h) Flooding on Corner opposite the Queen's Head, Tebworth. Cllr Green has followed this issue up with HW, which has carried out a detailed investigation and reported back to Cllr Green with a summary of what is causing the problem. The PC agreed to write to the residents of Holly Tree Cottage and Buttercup Farm as some of the drainage pipes run through their land.

- d) 800 Year Celebration Picnic took place on September 13th, 2020. The picnic was a socially distanced circle and limited to 30 people. The Rev Linda Washington thanked Cllr Parry and Lesley Smith for representing Chalgrave Parish Council and the community of Chalgrave at the picnic. The history and memories of the church were shared, followed by an informal Service of Thanksgiving for the church. The Bishop of Bedford, Bishop Richard attended with his wife. Linda apologised that the event could not be a bigger parish affair due to the current restrictions but she hopes to host a celebration when restrictions are lifted.

- **e)** <u>Toddington Church Youth Picnic</u> and activity session was held today in the church grounds. There was a Treasure Hunt, teaching and prayers.
