2. MINUTES OF DECEMBER 15TH, 2020 MEETING

The minutes of the December 15th, 2020 meeting were approved and signed as correct by the chairman.

5. REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLOR VERSALLION

- a) London Luton Airport (LLA) Consultation. NATS and LLA are proposing changing airspace for arrivals into Luton Airport with a new holding area north of the airport. Aircraft would be above 8,000 feet and the holding area would only be used in an emergency. Cllr Versallion thinks this part of Bedfordshire will experience no significant difference but there have been objections in other parts of the county.
- **b)** <u>Covid-19</u>. Vaccinations have begun and everyone should know where their vaccination centres are by now. There are many volunteers helping out at the centres.
- c) <u>CBC Budget</u>. There is a consultation at the moment. CBC is proposing a 2% increase in Council Tax and a 3% increase for adult social care.
- **d)** Chalgrave Manor Solar Farm. There is no update yet. The Tilsworth solar farm proposal has also gone quiet. There is a possibility that an application for another solar farm west of the A5 may be submitted. The large concentration of applications in this area is due to the proximity of the Sundon substation.
- e) New Leader for CBC. Richard Wenham is the new Leader. Cllr Versallion thinks he will be good.

6. MATTERS ARISING FROM DECEMBER 15th, 2020 MINUTES

- a) Lords Hill Roundabout. Lane re-marking ongoing.
- b) Flooding on Corner opposite the Queen's Head, Tebworth.
 - i. Cllr Green said that water is coming across Toddington Road and flowing down The Lane. He will follow
 up with the HW Area Technician. Ongoing.

- ii. Cllr Parry met with the contractor carrying out work on Hockliffe Road to discuss the recent flooding that occurred. The contractor has installed a pipe which, hopefully, will carry water away from the road.
- c) Festival of Britain Tebworth Sign. Signs of the Times (SOTT) has removed the damaged sign and is repairing it. One of the upright posts has also been damaged and needs replacing. The PC has received a revised quote of £540 approx. to remove both posts and replace them with wooden ones. Cllr Green commented that the concrete posts were part of the village's heritage. He offered to examine the damaged post and see if he could do anything himself. The PC unanimously agreed. Progressing.
- **d) Boundary Sign.** The Wingfield boundary sign has been damaged at the bottom right-hand side corner. The PC has asked SOTT to repair the damage. Progressing.
- e) Parking on Grass Verges. Currently, CBC has no policy about parking on grass verges and pavements and can only take action if parking restrictions are in place. Cllr Parry will draft a letter asking people not to park on the pavement.

12. HIGHWAYS ISSUES

- a) Parkview Lane. There was a long discussion about the flooding at the top of Parkview Lane and possible causes, one of which is the gulley across Wingfield Road from Parkview Lane. It was felt that the PC and CBC need to work together to alleviate the problem. Cllr Parry suggested regular clear outs of the soakaway and the need to act quickly. Ongoing.
- b) <u>Drains.</u> A blocked drain near Willow Tree Far has been reported to HW.
- c) Trees opposite 72 Wingfield Road. Cllr Warburton said that there are a couple of places where branches and foliage obscure the view and need cutting back. There is also a bushy shrub growing next to the boundary of 51 Wingfield Road which needs cutting back. Ongoing.

- **d)** <u>Driveway between Nos 78 & 80 Wingfield Road</u> is in poor condition It is due to be resurfaced in the spring. Ongoing.
- e) Yellow Lines on Wingfield Road. No date for installation yet. Ongoing.
- **f)** Street Signs. The Chalgrave Road sign at the junction with Lords Hill was knocked over some time ago and reported to HW but is still to be done. Ongoing.
- **Mud on The Lane, Tebworth.** The PC has received complaints about mud on The Lane. Cllr Parry has spoken to the farmers using The Lane. They will clean the road in a month or so. Ongoing.
- h) <u>Patching: The Lane, Tebworth.</u> HW has scheduled patching work on The Lane between 15-18 February 2021. Cllr Parry met with the Streetworks Manager to discuss arrangements for parking and access.

** Comments

- 1. The large number of applications that have been submitted to provide and store green energy in this area.
- 2. Each application is considered individually by Central Bedfordshire Council Planning. CBC has no strategic plan in place for providing green energy, which would look at the area as a whole.

- 3. All the applications are on Green Belt land, which is also being used for housing developments.
- 4. The Chalgrave Manor Solar Farm application is predominantly on Grade 3A agricultural land. Grade 3 land is defined as good to moderate quality agricultural land and the proposed solar farm site is being used for crop growing at the moment.
- 5. The Councillors queried how much green energy Central Bedfordshire needs to produce and how much it currently produces.
- ii. <u>Lane Farm.</u> Cllr Green commented that the developers had made a good job of rebuilding Lane Farm and its appearance was close to the original.

b) Rights of Way (ROW)

- i. <u>Stiles</u> near Toddington Road have not been repaired yet. However the one coming into Boggy Meadow has. Ongoing.
- ii. <u>Heritage Trail.</u> There will soon be an app, called Trail Tale, available for the Chalgrave Heritage Trail. Ongoing.
- iii. Way Marker Post. A way marker post lying in the ditch on Featherbed Lane will be put up again. Ongoing.
- iv. <u>Bridge.</u> The bridge on FP 8 is rotten. Cllr Green has reported it. Ongoing.
