#### 2. MINUTES OF September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021 MEETING

The minutes of the September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021 meeting were amended, approved and signed as correct by the chairman.

#### 3. SPECIFIC DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

#### 4. POLICE MATTERS

- a) <u>Reported Crime.</u> No crimes were reported in September 2021.
- b) Police and Crime Commissioner's Newsletter-October 2021. In correspondence. 2/10
- c) PCC Parish/Ward Cluster Sessions. Summary 2021. In correspondence. 4/10

### 5. REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLOR VERSALLION

- a) <u>Lords Hill Roundabout.</u> Cllr Versallion is disappointed with Highways England (HE) as they said the lane markings would be altered by the spring of 2021 and the work has still not been done. Cllr Parry said that this issue is now into its fifth year and Cllr Green commented that the road markings are very faint now. Cllr Versallion and Andrew Selous MP will continue to press action from HE. Ongoing.
- **b)** Proposed Changes to Flight Paths will not have an impact in this area. Biggleswade and Sandy may be affected.
- c) <u>M1-A6 Link Road.</u> Government funding of 32.7 million is secured for building the link road. The road will support the development of 3,600 new homes and around 2,800 new jobs.
- d) <u>Solar Farms.</u> An application for a 110-acre site near Hockliffe has been granted. Cllr Versallion has raised the need for a coordinated plan for solar farms with CBC. Both he and Cllr Mary Walsh, Ward Councillor for Toddington, have both raised the issue of the effect of solar farms on rural communities. Cllr Parry asked why solar panels were not being installed on new homes. Cllr Versallion is for this idea but the government will not mandate it.
- e) <u>Planning.</u> Cllr Green asked if enough schools were being built to cater for all the new houses being developed. Cllr Versallion replied that money was available. However there is capacity in the existing schools but not where the new houses are.

- f) <u>Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Points.</u> CBC does have a strategy however currently the default is that EV owners have to provide their own.
- **g)** Green Bins. In answer to a question from Cllr Green, Cllr Versallion said there not be a charge for emptying green bins.

#### 6. CHALGRAVE CHURCH REPORT

a) <u>Church and Church Grounds.</u> Rev Washington thanked the volunteers who tend the grounds and maintain the burial area. The Youth Group have enjoyed the grounds over the summer. They have met for picnics, activities, prayer and reflection. Visitors have enjoyed the history of the church and its sense of heritage. A local farmer and a church working party have cleared away brambles from some graves at the back of the church. This will need to be reviewed regularly to keep the growth under control. Additional help would be appreciated.

### b) Events.

- iii. Historic Churches Bike and Hike Day on September 12<sup>th</sup>. Mary represented All Saints, visiting several churches in the area and raising funds through sponsorship

- v. Christmas wreath making afternoon on November 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021
- vi. Fund raising events have been reduced because the church has been closed. As a result church funds will be in deficit again this year. Ideas for fundraising or becoming a regular donor would be welcome.
- c) <u>Church Maintenance.</u> The toilet facility and vestry cupboards installations have both been signed off with the architect. The organ has been serviced. A potentially decaying Chancel beam and restoration of falling plaster in the kitchen area are being investigated. The church is being encouraged by the diocese to reduce its carbon footprint and become an eco-church.

#### d) Services.

- i. <u>Sunday Morning Service</u> at 9.30am is back to normal and held regularly. There is a visiting organist and the church received a donation of a Bluetooth sound bar which allowed the congregation to listen to recorded music and hymns before it was allowed to sing.
- ii. <u>In Loving Memory Service</u> will be held on November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021 during the 9.30am service.
- iii. Remembrance Services will take place on November 14<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Details to be confirmed
- iv. Christmas Services.

  - Morning Carol Service-Sunday, December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021 at 9.30am
  - Crib Service and Christmas Eve services-details to be issued later.

It is hoped that all the Christmas services will be able to take place this year.

#### 7. MATTERS ARISING FROM SEPTEMBER 21<sup>st</sup>, 2021 MINUTES

- a) <u>Bedfordshire Police and Partnership Trust.</u> The PC received a request for a donation towards the Bobby Scheme, which was set up to help the vulnerable and elderly. PC to consider in November 2021.
- b) <u>Hockliffe Road Speed Sign.</u> The PC is buying three 'Speed Watch Area' signs: two to be installed at either end of Tebworth and one on Tebworth Road, location to be decided. The cost for the three signs and their installation will be £169.32 + VAT. The signs will be installed once the locations have been approved by the CBC Traffic Manager. Progressing.
- c) <u>Festival of Britain Tebworth Sign.</u> The concrete post has been repaired. Signs of the Times has repaired the sign and it will be put back in place. Progressing.
- d) <u>Tebworth Pond.</u> Cll Parry thanked Cllr Day, John Wojdyla and Lesley Smith for carrying out maintenance work on the pond on October 17<sup>th</sup>. Cllr Ludgate will investigate disposal of the resulting green waste left by the pond. There may be a cost for the collecting and disposal of the waste.
- e) Parkview Lane Flooding. The PC continues to follow up with HW on any progress to resolve the flooding issue. The PC agreed to keep pushing HW. The PC discussed a further clearance of the gulley in the near future.

- f) <u>CBC Tree Planting Scheme.</u> Cllr Parry suggested possible tree planting on the land in front of 37-51 The Lane, Tebworth. He will contact CBC.

- g) <u>Willow Tree, Parkview Lane.</u> Two more trees on Parkview Lane may require attention. The clerk has contacted Branching Out to come and examine and advise. <u>Clerk</u>
- h) <u>Proposed Changes to Eggington Parish Boundary.</u> The consultation sets out three options regarding the future of the parish boundary of Eggington. Consultation ends November 10th, 2021. The clerk has contacted Eggington PC asking for its views on the proposal. Awaiting reply. Follow up.
- i) <u>Litter Pick.</u> Cllr Warburton has organised a litter pick for October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021. He has carried out a risk assessment, which the PC signed off after discussion. CBC is providing the litter picking equipment free of charge.

#### 12. HIGHWAYS ISSUES

- a) <u>Hockliffe Road, Tebworth.</u> The PC reported the poor condition of the footway from Tebworth to the A5 to HW.
