b) Cllr Day reported that <u>Nitrous Oxide Phials</u> were found out side Signs of the Times last week.

5. REPORT FROM WARD COUNCILLOR MARK VERSALLION

- a) <u>Hockliffe; Variable Speed Cameras (VAS).</u> The ultimate goal is to detrunk the A5. In the meantime VAS cameras are to be installed.
- b) <u>CBC Budget 2023/24.</u> CBC expects to spend £500 million during the next financial year. Inflation for the council is £16 million but, because of the rise in the cost of living, CBC is aiming for a 0% rise in council tax. The deficit will come from £13 million held in reserves and money from new homes.
- c) <u>New Leisure Centres</u> are planned for Leighton Buzzard and Houghton Regis.
- d) <u>NHS.</u> Cllr Versallion is Chair of the Social Care, Health and Housing Overview and Scrutiny Committee. He met with the NHS yesterday. The NHS is having difficulty recruiting and retaining staff, particularly in Leighton Buzzard. There will be no more GP provision in Leighton Buzzard despite being given the money to do so. Marcel Coiffait Chief Executive CBC is meeting with an NHS representative soon.
- e) <u>Tebworth Solar Farm.</u> A meeting has been provisionally arranged between Chalgrave Parish Council and Enso, the developer. Cllr Versallion asked to be copied in on any correspondence between the Parish Council, Enso and Aton, the developer of Chalgrave Manor Solar Farm. <u>Clerk</u>

- f) Chalgrave Memorial Hall Play Area. Cllr Masters asked about possible grant funding for the play area.
- g) Pop Up Tea Room. Cllr Masters suggested that Cllr Versallion could meet constituents at one of the Tea Room mornings.
