## 9. MATTERS ARISING FROM APRIL 18th, 2023 MINUTES

a) <u>Invitation from PCC.</u> Chalgrave Speed Watch, along with other community Watch schemes were invited to a meeting at Kempston Police Headquarters on April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Cllr Parry and Lesley Smith attended.

## b) <u>Chalgrave Manor and Tebworth Solar Farms.</u>

- i. Silvia Collins, Ward Cllr for Toddington. Informed the PC that the Chalgrave Manor Solar Farm (CB/22/04302/FULL) application received approval again at the Development Management Committee meeting on April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2023. It had been deferred whilst waiting for Natural England's response to the consultation. They subsequently replied with no objection. Information in correspondence.
- ii. The PC will introduce the Memorial Hall Committee to Enso, the developer for Tebworth Solar Farm. The Committee are hoping to secure some funding for the new playground. **PP; Clerk**

## c) <u>McDonald's Hockliffe.</u>

- i. Cllrs Parry & Warburton to arrange a meeting with them about a possible combined litter pick. Ongoing. <u>PP; PW</u>
- ii. Cllr Warburton organized a litter pick for April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023. 18 bags of rubbish were collected. The ditches are the main problem.
- iii. CBC are likely to prosecute 2 people for fly tipping on Chalgrave Road.

## d) Grass Verges and Rewilding.

- i. The PC has asked CBC's Environment Team to come and talk to us. Meeting to be arranged. Progressing. <u>Clerk</u>
- ii. Cllr Ludgate will investigate whether landowners have to cut back hedges that overhang HW land. Report the overgrown hedge at the corner of Chalgrave Road and the B5120 to HW as a hazard as it restricts visibility at the junction.
- iii. Information about CBC's tree planting scheme in correspondence. There have been complaints about the newly planted trees on Wingfield Road and other locations. Contact CBC-we were not consulted and some of the trees are planted close to utility cables. <u>Clerk</u>
- e) <u>Parkview Lane.</u> Continue to monitor flooding.
- f) <u>Coronation of King Charles 111</u>. Commemorative mugs have been given to children of the parish who are under 18. Remaining mugs are on sale for £4.50 each. Contact the clerk or parish cllrs if interested.

## 10. <u>REPORT FROM Clir MARK VERSALLION</u>

- **b)** <u>Potholes and Grass Cutting.</u> CBC now has a contract with Milestone Infrastructure for HW maintenance. HW is beginning to fill in vacant posts within CBC.

c) <u>Housebuilding.</u> In answer to a question from Cllr Warburton, Cllr Versallion said that a call for sites is commencing. However, the government may ease up on housebuilding targets if population growth decreases.
