1. <u>APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE</u>

None.

2. MINUTES OF DECEMBER 19th, 2023 MEETING

The minutes of December 19th, 2023 meeting were approved by the council and signed as correct by the chair.

3. SPECIFIC DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Cllr Spiers declared interests in:

- Chalgave Memorial Hall; she is a member of the committee.
- The Chalgrave News; she is on the editorial team.
- All Saints Church, Chalgrave.

4. <u>GUEST: LINDSAY MEASURES-Rights of Way Officer (South 1)</u>

Lindsay thanked Cllr Green for all his work on the parish's rights of way (ROW).

- a) <u>P3 Groups.</u> Forming a P3 group within a parish is always helpful in maintaining the ROW. Otherwise CBC has to hire contractors to do the work. P3 members walk the ROW and carry out maintenance. Lindsay can provide equipment and insurance to cover volunteers. She will arrange training for using strimmers etc. Cllr Spiers has volunteered to help. Cllr Parry will put an article in the Chalgrave News.
- **b)** <u>Stiles.</u> Cllr Green said that all the stiles were in bad condition.
- c) <u>Footpath 17</u> continues to be the biggest problem. There are sheep in one of the fields, which is surrounded with an electric fence and there is no way through.
- **d)** <u>Landowners.</u> Cllr Warburton asked if permission was needed from landowners to carry out ROW work on their land. Cllr Green said that the farmers were generally cooperative.

Lindsay concluded by saying that most of Highways budget goes on the roads so little is left for ROW.

5. <u>REPORT FROM WARD CLLR VERSALLION</u>

- a) <u>CBC Budget.</u> The budget meeting will be held on February 6th, 2024. It is likely that council tax will increase by 5%. CBC has an overspend of £10 million. However CBC has reasonable reserves in the bank.
- **b)** <u>Ministry of Defence Land, Chicksands.</u> The CBC offices are built on former MOD land. The government has announced that the rest of the land could be sold within the next few years.
- c) <u>M1-A6 Link Road</u> looks in jeopardy because the developers will not finance the £13 million gap needed to complete the project. It could be another 5 years before completion.

- d) <u>Queen's Head.</u> Cllr Green proposed that the PC sends a letter to Highways (HW) asking for clarification on how HW land is defined and the origins and reasons for this. All Agreed. Cllr Versllion agreed to deliver the letter by hand to the relevant person at HW once he had received it from the clerk. <u>Clerk</u>
- e) <u>The Plough Inn.</u> Cllr Versallion will support the PC's application to make The Plough a Community Asset. He said that CBC would accept any additional evidence to support the importance of the pub to the community.
- f) <u>Ward Councillor Grant.</u> Cllr Parry asked if any money was still available. Cllr Versallion said 'yes' and to apply as soon as possible.
- g) Lords Hill Roundabout. Cllr Hydes mentioned that there had been several accidents on the roundabout when turning left from the Toddington direction onto the bypass, possibly caused by the camber. Contact National Highways to report.

6. REPORT FROM CHALGRAVE CHURCH. Report by the Rev. Linda Washington

- a) <u>Christmas Services</u> went well with good attendance. The church was decorated beautifully. Linda thanked Cllr Parry for reading a lesson on behalf of the PC. Carol Services also took place at Toddington Church.
- b) <u>Senior Citizens' Afternoon Tea.</u> Linda attended the Afternoon Tea held on December 2nd, 2023 at Parkfields Middle School. She chatted to many parishioners while she was there and took away spare food to distribute to people in the village.
- c) <u>Christmas Hamper Bags.</u> Both churches prepared hamper bags for families and individuals in need. The parcels were made possible by donations from church members and the Toddington Church 'Love Fund'.
- d) <u>Chalgrave Churchyard.</u> Volunteers, including Roger Fenwick, have cut back overgrown shrubs. The Portaloo will be removed as it is no longer needed. Linda thanked everyone who has helped to maintain the grounds during the year.
- e) <u>Church Beams.</u> The church beams in the Nave have been surveyed by the church architect and the church builder. One beam is rotting at one end. Permission from the Diocese will be needed before going ahead with the repair. The internal eaves of the Chancel will be investigated and a hatch will be cut out on the right-hand side of the Chancel so birds' nests etc. can be cleared away. These have been causing potential damp and rot issues. Hopefully the church will remain open for Sunday services but fund raising and other activities will not happen until the work is completed. The costs are already £37,000 with further costs for the repair of the Nave beam.
- f) <u>Pop Up Tearoom</u>. The tea room will continue every month. The Memorial Hall Committee is paid £20 for each session. The funds raised add to the church finances. Linda thanked all those who provide the cakes and savouries and help on the day. She also thanked the attendees.
- **g)** <u>Community Funding.</u> The Memorial Hall Committee has asked the church and the PC to support an application for funding. The church is happy to support.

h) Services at Chalgrave Church

- i) March 29th, 2024: Good Friday morning service at 10am
- j) March 31st, 2024: Easter Day service with Holy Communion at 9.30am
- k) <u>The Year Ahead.</u> It is hoped to lead a benefice Alpha course, Confirmation classes and a home benefice group. Linda asked for ideas on how the church can become more involved within the parish. She thanked the PC for its annual grant to help towards the maintenance of the church grounds.

8. MATTERS ARISING FROM DECEMBER 19th, 2023 MINUTES

a) Chalgrave Manor and Tebworth Solar Farms.

i. <u>Chalgrave Manor Solar Farm.</u> The developers have applied for Discharge of Conditions, which mainly relate to maintaining and encouraging biodiversity on the site. The PC objects to this application-see Item 15a)i.

- ii. <u>Tebworth Solar Farm.</u> Follow up with the agents about the public meeting for Tebworth Solar Farm and ask for the website to be updated. <u>Clerk</u>
- **b)** <u>**Tebworth Pond.**</u> The PC will plan to carry out maintenance work on the pond in the autumn.
- c) <u>Ice opposite the Queen's Head Pub.</u> The PC has responded to an email from a Tebworth resident asking what is being done to reduce the potential for frozen water on the bend. Cllr Green mentioned the flooding on Wingfield Road. The PC continues to press HW into finding solutions to both issues.
